

The Arc de triomphe was begun in 1806 on the orders of Napoleon I to honour the victories of his Grande Armée.

Inspired by the great arches of antiquity, this iconic monument bears the names of battles and generals from the Revolution and the First Empire. The Arc de Triomphe museum takes visitors on a journey back in time to discover the true meanings of the sculptures that adorn its façades. On the top floor, the panoramic terrace affords unique views of Paris by day and night.

DID YOU KNOW...?

On 7 August 1919, pilot Charles Godefroy decided to take his fighter plane out for a spin and managed to fly through the 29m x 14m 'hole'.
