

# Coming to the Monument

Access by taking the **Passage du** Souvenir, at the top of the Champs-Élysées or the Grande-Armée Avenues

By car: take the Porte Maillot exit and the Grande-Armée Avenue or take the Porte Dauphine exit and the Foch Avenue Drop-off point accessible on the forecourt side of the Grande Armée Avenue

By bike: Vélib' stations on Arsène Houssaye Street, Hoche Avenue, Beaujon Street, Balzac Street, and **Traktir Street** 

By public transport: M1, M2, M6, and RER A, Charles-de-Gaulle-Étoile station. Bus lines 22, 30, 31, 52, 73, 92 and Balabus



### **Opening Hours**

Summer Season April 1st to September 30th: 10 am to 11 pm

Winter Season October 1st to March 31st: 10 am to 10:30 pm

#### **Annual closures**

January 1st, May 1st, May 8th (morning), July 14th (morning), November 11th (morning), December 25th



#### Welcome and Accessibility

**Access** to the museum and terrace: 284 steps or elevator available without the need for prior reservation

Free access to the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier and free entry to the monument for those under **26 years old** (EU)

Possibility to leave strollers at the monument access point

Maximum allowed luggage size: 40x40x20cm (no luggage storage available)

#### Visitor Comfort

**Changing facilities** available in the restrooms

Seating available for your convenience in the visiting areas

Please bring windproof clothing for your comfort

Picnics are not allowed within the monument, but you will find **shops** and green spaces in the neighborhood for dining

Ordered by Napoleon I in 1806 in honor of the imperial armies, the Arc de Triomphe was completed during the reign of Louis-Philippe in 1836. In 1921, following the burial of the Unknown Soldier, it became a significant place of memory where the Republic gathers on November 11th and May 8th or during the National Day.
